Grandma Susie's Sundae Cake

Grandma Susie's Sundae Cake

Henrietta Singleterry, Portales, NM 2022

Crust:

- ½ cup melted butter
- 1 ½ c all-purpose flour
- 2 Tablespoons sugar
- ½ cup chopped nuts

Cream cheese layer:

- 16 oz. soft cream cheese
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1 cup cool whip

1 LG box of Cook and serve Chocolate Pudding

1 LG box of Cook and serve Vanilla Pudding

Milk

Maraschino cherries

A few extra chopped nuts

Leftover cool whip

Crust- mix all ingredients. Press into the bottom of a 13x9 baking dish.

Cream cheese layer – mix all layer ingredients. Spread onto cooled crust.

Mix puddings separately. Spread chocolate pudding on top of the cream cheese layer. Then spread vanilla pudding on top of the chocolate layer. Cool. Spread the remaining cool whip on top of the vanilla pudding. Top with cherries and nuts. Serve cold

What to do before using a PORTABLE GENERATOR



Prepare

Install battery operated carbon monoxide (CO) alarms throughout your home; ensure they are working properly.

Position

Place a portable generator at least 20 feet from windows and doors; do not use one in a garage or carport.



Read

Carefully review and then follow all manufacturer's instructions.

Protect

If it is wet outside, keep it dry by placing it on a tarp. Position it under a portable canopy (not a carport).



Refuel Safely

Turn off your portable generator and let it cool down before refueling.

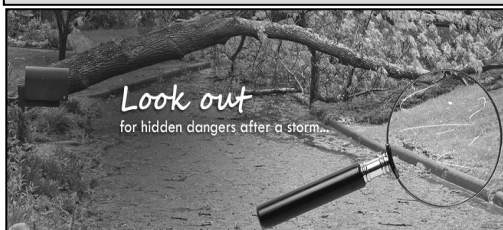
Inspect and Maintain

Inspect a portable generator before each use and make sure it is properly maintained.



Using a portable generator can be useful during an outage; however, use one correctly to prevent CO poisoning and to stay safe.

Non-Residential Deposits

Delinquent nonresidential accounts without a continuing letter of guaranty from financial institution are required to pay a deposit equal to 25% of the delinquent bill. On 3rd consecutive delinquency, a deposit equal to 1/6th of the estimated annual billing will be assessed.

Space heaters need space. Papers, clothing blanket, and other flammables should be kept at least 3 feet away.

Residential Deposits

For residential consumers a deposit equal to 1/6th of the estimated annual billing is required if the account becomes delinquent three or more times in one year. After that year, the deposit may be refunded and applied to the next month's bill provided the account has not been delinquent in that year. If a service is disconnected, the deposit is applied to the final bill if all requirements have been met.
